Explore Cayman's ancient, original growth fascinating forests - the wonderful dry, **rocky** woodlands, - her living museums - wherein are found the plants that sustained the first settlers and their descendants - Silver Thatch, Ironwood, Cedar, Mahogany, Candlewood etc. Look for orchids, bromeliads, ferns, mosses, lichens, fungi, birds, crabs, bugs, spiders and other forest creatures. Know the plants to avoid touching - Maiden Plum, Manchineel, Lady Hair, Shake Hand trees.
